Tim, son of John and Cindy Cunningham, Alvin, Texas, is survived by his wife, Samantha Cunningham and daughter, Abigail Lynn, currently living at Ft. Campbell, Kentucky; sister, Christy Dawn Cunningham, Austin, Texas; brother, Captain John David Cunningham and wife, Jamie Lynn Cunningham also residing at Ft. Campbell with John currently on deployment in Iraq; sister, Sara Beth Cunningham, McAllen, Texas; sister, Kelsey Lynn Cunningham, Alvin, Texas; grandparents Wayne and Marian Cunningham of Spring, Texas and Edgar and Jean Jones of Panorama Village, Texas; niece and nephew, Emily and T.J. Bolton of Austin, Texas as well as aunts, uncles, cousins and friends from around the country.

Tim is also survived by Samantha's family from Alvin, including Guy and Wanda Skinkis; brother Dylan, brother Dakota, sister Savannah Skinkis, and brother Jonathan Morgenroth as well as numerous aunts, uncles, cousins.
