Shardley Geletta Paul (formerly) Glinton was born in South Caicos, Turks & Caicos Islands, British West Indies on August 10th 1951. The 2nd of six children to the late Oliver Nathaniel Glinton and Laurie Elizabeth Glinton (formerly) Lightbourne of the Turks and Caicos Islands. She received her primary and secondary education in South Caicos, Turks & Caicos Islands. She furthered her education at Blue Water Bible College in St Thomas in the United States Virgin Islands, where she graduated with a theology degree and an Advanced Teachers certificate. She continued her education and in 2002 she obtained a Bachelors degree in Religious Education.

Shardley was raised in a Christian home of godly parents who cared for, and nurtured their children in the fear and admonition of the Lord.
