Janet Pearl Albers Fake passed away on April 26th, 2022 at the age of 68.

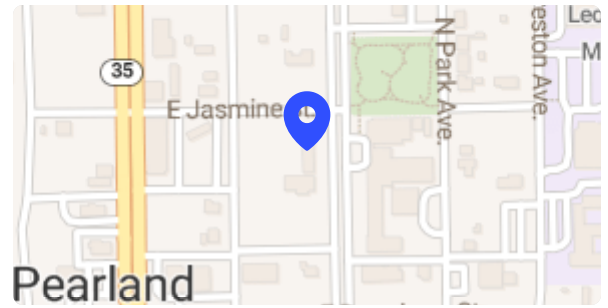
