Fred O'Brien, rest in peace knowing that your love and legacy will forever be etched in our hearts. Thank you for the gift of your presence in our lives.



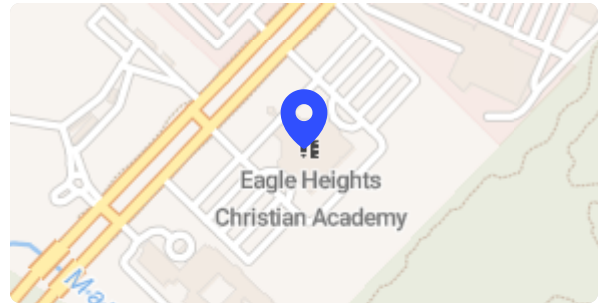

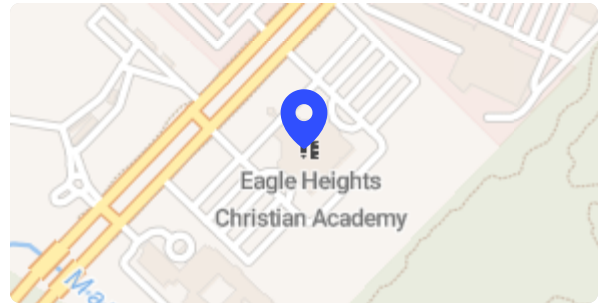
