A Celebration of Life will be held at 3:30 PM on Saturday, January 20th, 2024, at Christ Church Sugar Land located at 3300 Austin Pkwy in Sugar Land, Texas, for James Virgil Harris Jr, 94, who passed away on January 6, 2024.

Born in Ardmore, Oklahoma, he was the son of the late James Virgil Harris Sr and the former Dessie A. Thomas. He was preceded in death by his parents, six brothers and sisters, and son in law. 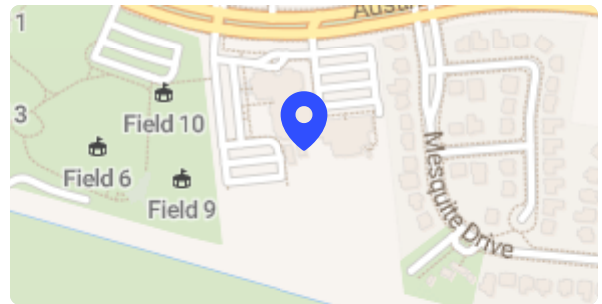
