While at Alvin High School, he was a varsity letterman for two years, earning honors as defensive player of the year and all-district honorable mention.

Upon graduation, Adam attended Junior College and became interested in Criminal Justice. Ultimately, he attended the Police Academy at Alvin Community College. 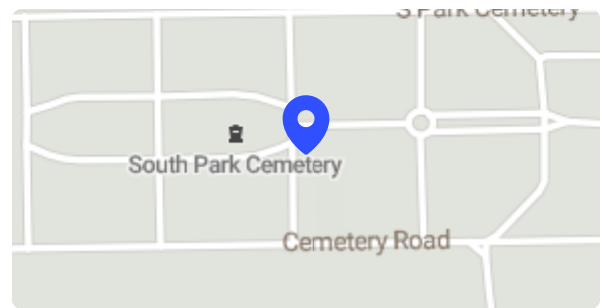

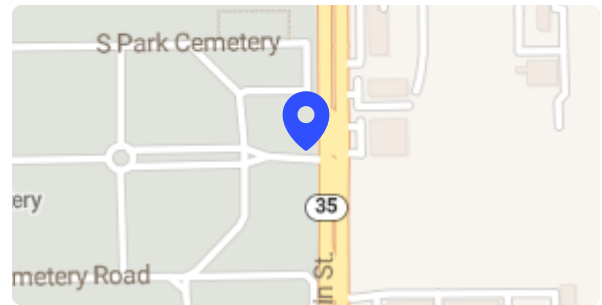
