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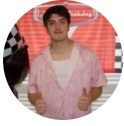
# **Aleman, Christian Nicholas**

**C**hristian Nicholas Aleman, known to his father and immediate family as “Bug”, has been commended into the arms of the Lord. Born in Houston, Texas on June 19, 2002, at 3:30pm and passed into the next phase of his journey on July 18, 2025, in Pearland, Texas where he called home for the past nineteen years at the young age of 23.

Christian was known for his kind heart; limitless love and affection for all children (young and old); unconditional forgiveness towards all persons; reverence for all creations from the tiniest insect to vast wonders in the universe; unwavering admiration and devotion for his family and friends; and most of all his ability to support and heal those who sometimes felt forgotten. As an avid runner, he ventured out both day and night to enjoy all that surrounded him and brought him serenity.
