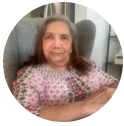

May she rest in eternal peace, reunited with her beloved Frank, and may her memory continue to inspire faith, love and compassion of the life she touched.



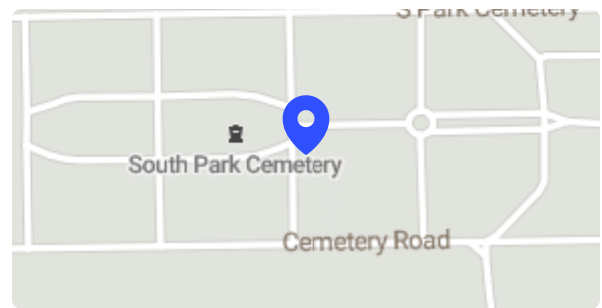
